## IMPORTANT CHANGES TO COMPETITION

## 1. Digital images must be submitted to competition on the FIRST THURSDAY of the month by midnight

#### 2. The Monochrome Digital Image Category has been added

- There now are three Digital Image Categories: General, Monochrome, Creative/Artistic
- Into each category, you can enter:
  - ⇒ General Up to 2 images
  - ⇒ Monochrome 1 image
  - ⇒ Creative/Artistic 1 image

#### Monochrome Digital Image Rules:

- ⇒ A member CAN submit an image in the General Category, then convert that image to monochrome, and submit it into the Monochrome Category
- ⇒ A member CANNOT submit the same monochrome image into both the General Category and Monochrome Category

#### Definition of Categories:

- ⇒ General Open category. Includes all genres such as nature, pictorial, monochrome, infrared, etc.
- ⇒ Monochrome Image must be tints/shades of one color
- ⇒ Creative/Artistic Photography producing an image using imaginative skill or originality of thought, including the altering of reality. Includes modifications made on the computer or in the camera





  - 4. Maximum file size is 10 MB per photo. Formats accepted: png, gif, jpg, jpeg, bmp.

Using some fairly simple software, you can turn a dull image into something really cool and impactful.

Gerrie Gilcrist has been kind enough to share some of her before and after images to illustrate Luminar 4 and Aurora HDR software. Luminar makes it super easy to change the sky (among other things) and Aurora HDR 2019 is an

HDR (high dynamic range) photo editing application. Both are from Skylum software and do not require a subscription. Luminar uses Artificial Intelligence to brilliantly and simply allow you to replace a sky! (Keep in mind for competition at South Towns you have to use a sky you photographed—not one that comes with the software).
